Curriculum Recommended by the CPRC – AFP

5.1 a. Motion: “That Education Council approves the course revision: BIOL 012: Biology 012 as recommended by the CPRC - AFP”

Proposal Rationale

Changing Biology 011 from a pre-requisite to a recommended one.

5.1 b. Motion: “That Education Council approves the course revision: PHYS 012: Physics 012 as recommended by the CPRC - AFP”

Proposal Rationale

Cleaned up corequisite language on Kualii

5.1 c. Motion: “That Education Council approves the course revision: CHEM 012: Chemistry 012 as recommended by the CPRC - AFP”

Proposal Rationale

Co-requisite was wrong in Kualii so needed to be corrected.

5.1 d. Motion: “That Education Council approves the course revision: ENGL 012: English 012 as recommended by the CPRC - AFP”

Proposal Rationale

Changes to OC pre-requisites need to be made now that there have been changes to English courses offered in the K-12 system. Not all of the new K-12 courses prepare students for success in English 012, so removing some of the courses from the list.

Proposal Rationale

Course hours changed to align with the Provincial Curriculum. Changed from 140 to 135. Course outline provided. Calendar description updated to align with Provincial Curriculum and course outline.

5.2 b. Motion: “That Education Council approves the course revision: PNSG 216 Integrated Nursing Practice II as recommended by the CPRC - STH”

Proposal Rationale

Change of course hours to align with the Provincial Curriculum. Changed from 175 to 180. Added course outline, change calendar description to match provincial curriculum and course outline.

5.2 c. Motion: “That Education Council approves the course revision: PNSG 316 Integrated Nursing Practice III as recommended by the CPRC - STH”

Proposal Rationale

Course hours changed to align with the Provincial Curriculum. Changed from 186 to 180. Added course outline. Change calendar description to match Provincial curriculum and course outline.
