Continuing Studies, InspirED

6.1 New Program

- i. [Office Basics Microcredential \(MCOBAS\)](#)

M. Kline presented the new Office Basics Microcredential (MCOBAS) to members noting that funding was received by Westbank First Nation to support the program. Westbank First Nation chose to create MCOBAS with Okanagan College and were provided funding

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through the ministry. M. Kline recognized the work that R. Dupis, L. O'Donoghue, and C. Meissner contributed to creating the program.

Chris Newitt joined the meeting at 4:13p.m.

C. Meissner outlined the contents of the courses OBAS 100 - Computer Essentials and OBAS - 101 Office Skills to members noting that Westbank First Nation and an Elder were consulted in the development of the courses.

A member asked if there is an overlap between the proposed Office Basics Microcredential and the existing Office Administration programs and if there is an opportunity for learners to receive exemptions. B. Ridgeley noted that learners can receive transfer credit for the course OADM 167 - Computer Essentials when completing MCOBAS. There is an overlap between the programs although MCOBAS is offered as contract training for First Nation bands in a cohort.

A member asked if the program is exclusive to Indigenous students. C. Meissner noted that the program is strictly cohort based, and the community will identify learners suitable for the program. I. Wheeler noted that the program will be listed on the academic calendar with contact information to direct interested learners. Members discussed the differences between the MCOBAS and the existing Office Administration offerings noting that MCOBAS may encourage learners to join Office Administration if they choose to further their education.

ii. ***Community Administrator Microcredential (MCCOAD)***

M. Kline presented the new Community Administrator Microcredential (MCCOAD) to members noting that funding was received by Westbank First Nation to support the program. M. Kline noted the contribution of Z. Webster and L. O'Donoghue to the proposal.

Z. Webster provided an overview of the courses COAD 100 - Grant Writing Fundamentals and COAD 101 Project Management Fundamentals.

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A member expressed concerns about COAD 101 - Project Management Fundamentals overlapping with MGR 342 – Project Management and asked how similar the courses are suggesting that there may be other similar courses within the School of Business. M. Kline noted that the Business and Aviation Curriculum Proposal Review Committee reviewed the proposal expressing the different learning outcomes and goals of the courses do not qualify significant overlap. J. Garrett suggested that questions around similar courses arise in Education Council frequently and would like to discuss at Academic Regulations and Policy Committee.

A member asked for clarification regarding the minimum qualification to teach the courses. J. Ragsdale noted that she has been working on informed practice guidelines and ways to recognize informed practice and Indigenization opportunities at the request of Indigenous partnerships.

Z. Webster presented the course COAD 102 - Leadership Skills Fundamentals to members.

A member noted that none of the courses have required prerequisites and asked if learners could select which courses. Z. Webster noted prerequisites were not added to the program to reduce entry barriers.

Z. Webster presented the course COAD 103 – Workplace Wellness Fundamentals to members.

A member asked for clarification regarding the program’s residency requirements. M. Kline clarified that standard residency requirements of Okanagan College were included in the proposal. There are no options to complete the program at another institution, meaning this requirement does not currently apply.

Background Statement:

As part of the initiative to renew the Education Council's governing documents and with support from the Governance Office, the Chair has conducted a review of the current Education Council Committee structure. It is important that the structure of the Council's committees support and provide appropriate guidance and recommendations to the Council to allow it to effectively carry out its responsibilities as a governing body.

Based on research conducted on other BC colleges and taking into consideration the principles outlined below, attached for consideration and comment is the outline of a new committee structure.

The updated structure is primarily intended to support the efficiency of Education Council in more effectively exercising their governance responsibilities. The revised structure reduces the number of Council committees, ensuring that members are only required to serve on one committee thereby minimizing their workload and their ability to exercise their responsibility and authority as Council members.

Recommendation:

To receive advice from Education Council members on the proposed committee principles.

Rationale:

To date, the review of the Committee structure and subsequently any changes that will be recommended are based on the following principles:

- That the structure aligns with best practice;
- That the structure provides clear direction as it relates to governance responsibilities;
- That the structure ensures that Education Council operates effectively; and
- That the structure incorporates appropriately the authority of the Council outlined in the College and Institute Act.

The attached committee structure outlines the goals for each committee based on these principles. Before formalizing a final recommendation on the committee structure for the Council to consider, feedback is requested on the principles and their application to the attached draft committee structure and goals of each committee.

Should Education Council support the principles and goals, the proposed committee structure and any advice provided will move forward for consultation with program area Deans at Provost Council. Following that consultation, Education Council will receive recommendations for the Committee structure including draft Terms of Reference for each Committee.

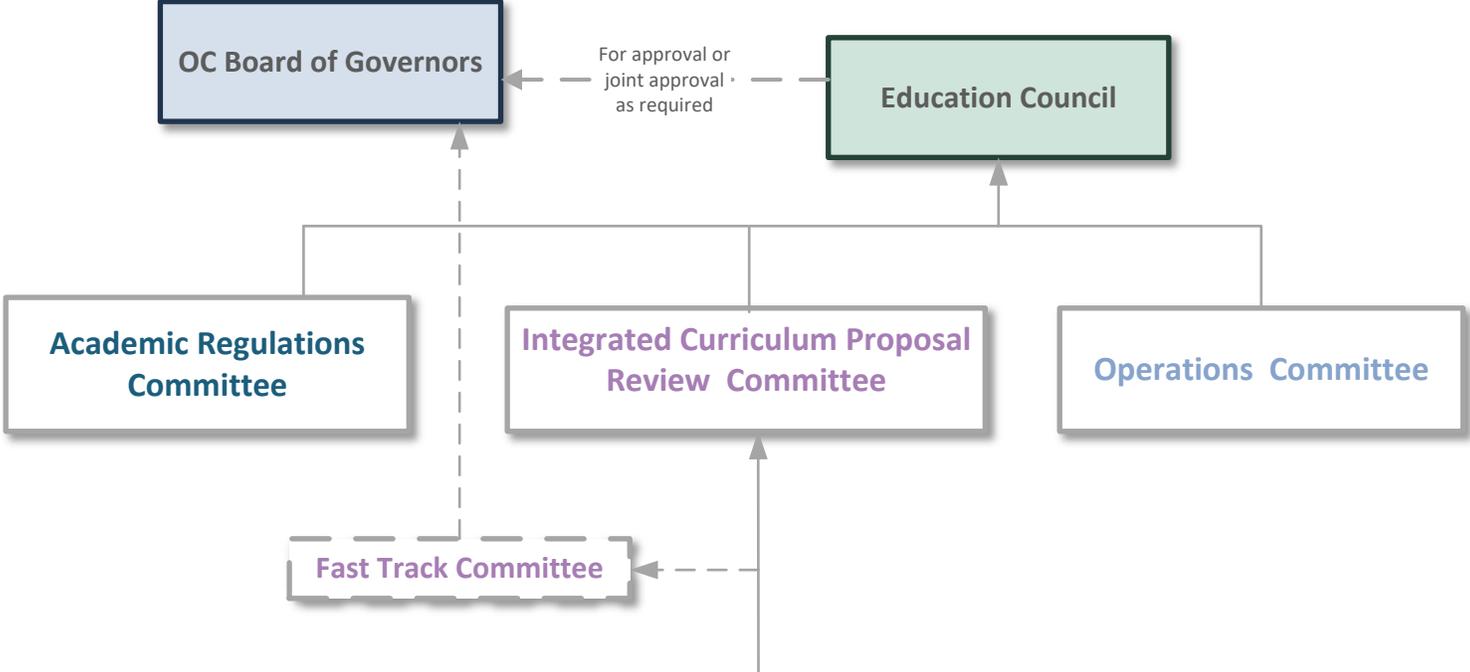

Draft Ed Council Committee Structure

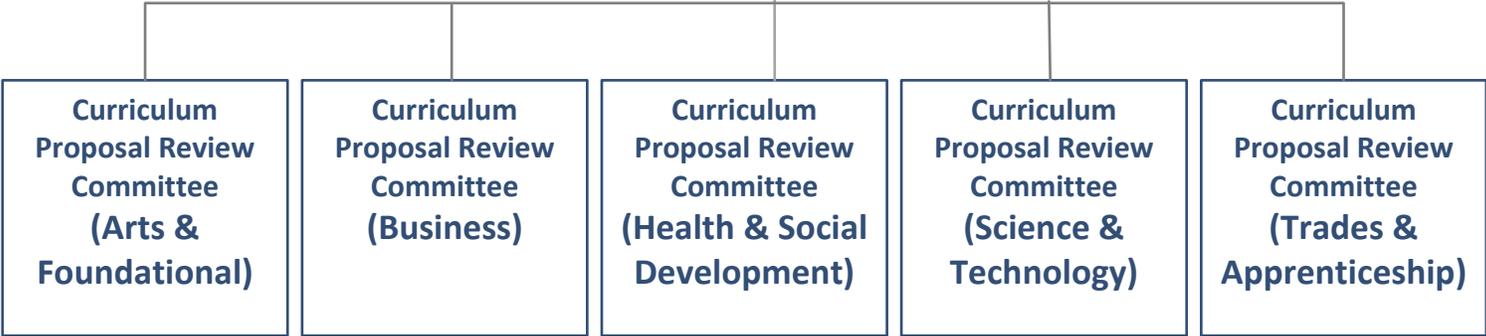
